What is NCAEOP, Inc.?

NCAEOP, Inc., stands for the North Carolina Association of Educational Office Professionals, Inc. We are an association that is interested in learning more about our profession and who wants to grow and develop professionally.

In 1951, the North Carolina Association of Educational Secretaries was organized. The name of the association became the North Carolina Association of Educational Office Personnel, Inc., in 1973, and in 1993, the membership voted to change the name to the North Carolina Association of Educational Office Professionals, Inc.

NCAEOP, Inc., is comprised of a board of directors which consists of president, president-elect, vice president, secretary, immediate past president, and fourteen district presidents. Subject to the NCAEOP, Inc., constitution and bylaws, the elected officers carry out the functions of the association. Officers of NCAEOP, Inc., are elected. The new officers are installed at the annual conference in March.

NCAEOP, Inc., is made up of fourteen districts. At least one district meeting with inservice training is held each year in addition to local unit meetings. Officer positions and committee work allow members to be involved in the decision-making of the association at the local, district, and state levels.

The North Carolina Association of Educational Office Professionals, Inc., is an affiliate of the National Association of Educational Office Professionals (NAEOP).

Membership is open to educational office personnel and administrators within the educational system (public and private) in North Carolina. No other educational association in this state makes itself so readily accessible to a single professional class of persons who cover the complete spectrum of education.

Professional Standards Program

The continuing education of educational office professionals is essential to cope with rapidly changing conditions in the profession.

NCAEOP, Inc., has developed a Professional Standards Program (PSP) designed to promote the opportunity for members to enhance their professional competencies through academic programs, conferences, and workshops. These activities enable the members to take progressive steps to their desired professional growth level.

Various certificates are available depending on the educational level the participant has reached. Each certificate is based on requirements in three areas: education, experience, and professional activity.

Scholarship Program

In March 1971, the state association established its first student scholarship in the name of Barbara A. Peeler in the amount of \$200.

Since then, NCAEOP, Inc., has continued to establish scholarships in the name of individuals who have made outstanding contributions to our association. Among these names have included Pauline T. Helms, Wanza Y. Davis, Lula M. Burrell, Lena Belle Parsons, Guy B. Teachey, Mildred F. Chrisco, Charlie Mae Holland and Joanne V. Williams. Moreover, since that time, NCAEOP, Inc., has awarded over \$223,877 to some 447 students and 63 members.

In addition to the state scholarships, the 14 districts and 105 locals have established student and EOP scholarships. Currently, these locals and districts have awarded over \$50,000 annually to deserving students and members.

In total, NCAEOP, Inc., has awarded over \$1,000,000 in scholarship money over the past 47 years! This success has only been possible through the efforts of our members who have made individual contributions in their bake sales, raffles, silent auctions, and many other creative endeavors.



Insurance Program

One of the membership benefits is a \$1,000 life insurance policy, regardless of age or a \$2,000 accidental death and dismemberment policy, up to age 70.
